## WASHINGTON COASTAL DUNGENESS CRAB INDUSTRY NOTICE

## **Season Opening Delayed in Washington**

Coastal Dungeness crab Tri-State policy representatives from the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) have agreed to open the commercial Dungeness crab season south of Cape Falcon, OR to the OR/CA border on December 16, 2025. Fishery managers have made the decision to delay the opening of the 2025-26 Coastal Dungeness crab fishery from Cape Falcon, OR (45° 46'00" N. Lat.) to the US/Canada border through at least December 30, 2025. This decision was based on crab condition tests conducted by WDFW that do not currently meet the minimum meat recovery criteria (see below).

Tri-State Dungeness Crab Pre-Season Testing Protocols specify that after the second round of testing, if any area does not meet the minimum meat recovery criteria (23% north of Cascade Head and 24% south of Cascade Head) a delay is required, and additional testing is conducted before a season opening date can be confirmed. WDFW will provide additional information regarding the season opening as soon as possible following the completion of the upcoming tests to be completed by December 22, 2025.

## WASHINGTON TEST RESULTS

The stations in the Long Beach test area were completed on December 1, 2025. The results for all stations are summarized below.
