

Grays Harbor Telemetry Equipment

An acoustic telemetry study is currently underway on the Chehalis River and in Grays Harbor evaluating outmigration behavior and survival of juvenile Chinook salmon, coho salmon, and steelhead. Acoustic telemetry receivers are deployed at several locations in Grays Harbor and will be present during April-August 2026. The deployments will be along the Harbor bottom and consist of: (1) an anchor; (2) acoustic release; (3) acoustic receiver; and (4) sub-surface buoy. Each deployment will extend vertically upward from the bottom for approximately 8 feet.

General locations of telemetry deployments are circled in red on the embedded map. GPS coordinates of specific deployments will be provided at a later date.
